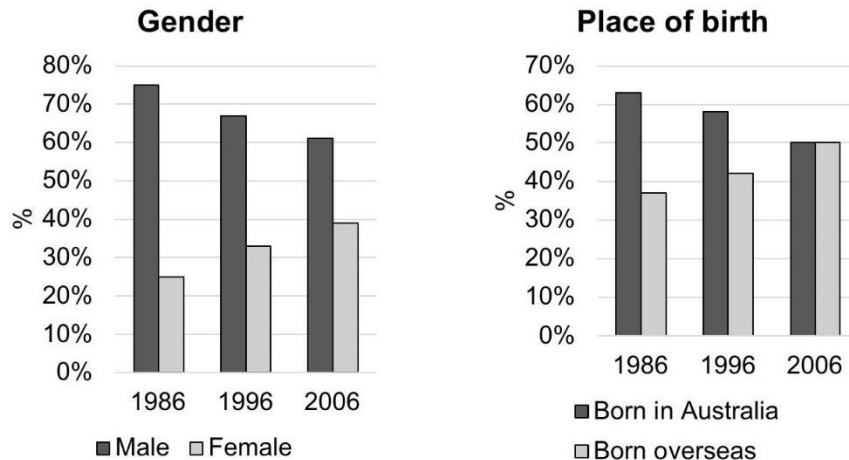

The table and bar charts provide information about the number of doctors in Australia in 1986, 1996, and 2006. Additionally, they show the distribution of doctors by gender and place of birth for the same years.

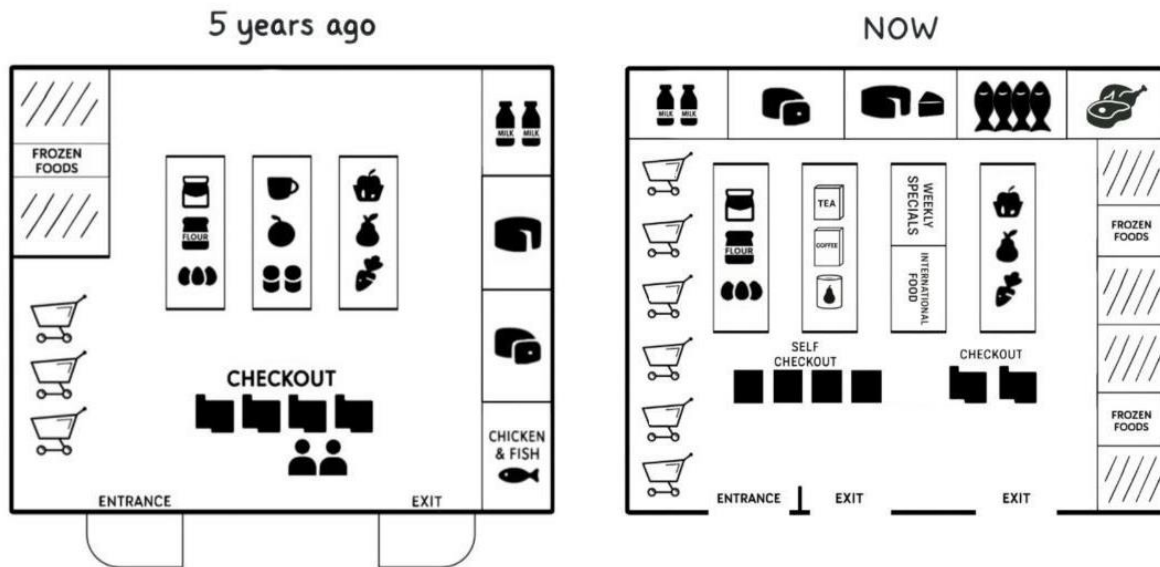
The total number of doctors in Australia increased steadily over the period. The proportion of female doctors saw a significant rise during these years, though male doctors remained the majority throughout. Additionally, while the percentage of doctors born in Australia declined, the proportion of overseas-born doctors rose.

The number of doctors in Australia grew significantly over the years. In 1986, there were 23,720 doctors, which increased to 29,060 by 1996, and further rose to 35,450 in 2006. This demonstrates a consistent upward trend in the total number of doctors throughout the two decades.

In terms of gender, male doctors accounted for the majority throughout the period. In 1986, over 70% of doctors were male, while less than 30% were female. By 1996, the proportion of female doctors had risen to around 35%, and by 2006, this figure had reached almost 40%. Meanwhile, the percentage of male doctors decreased over the years but remained higher than females in all years.

When considering place of birth, around 60% of doctors in 1986 were born in Australia, while roughly 30% were born overseas. By 2006, the percentage of Australian-born doctors had fallen to around 50%, while the proportion of overseas-born doctors rose to approximately 40%, indicating a shift in the composition of the medical workforce. The two maps illustrate the transformation of a supermarket over a five-year period. Overall, the supermarket has undergone significant changes, including the reorganization of aisles, the introduction of new sections, and the implementation of modern checkout facilities. Notably, there has been an expansion in product variety, alongside an improved layout.

In the past, the supermarket had a simpler layout with just a single Frozen Foods section on the left, alongside three central aisles dedicated to basic groceries such as Flour, Eggs, and various fruits and vegetables. The Chicken & Fish section was located along the right-hand side, while the Milk and Cheese products occupied separate shelves. The checkout area was positioned near the entrance and exit at the bottom of the layout.

Currently, the supermarket has seen considerable transformations. The Frozen Foods section has doubled in size and is now situated along the right-hand side. Meanwhile, Milk and Cheese have been relocated to the top left, adjacent to a new Meat section. Additional aisles for Tea, Coffee, and Cooking Oil have been introduced, along with dedicated spaces for Weekly Specials and International Food. The entrance and exit have also been repositioned, with the entrance now located on the left side and two separate exits on the right. Furthermore, the checkout area has been modernized with Self-Checkouts stations in the center, and the main checkout counters have been moved to the far right. (232 words)
